1.1 College Operational Policy

1.1.1 Our Educational Approach

In our effort to provide a comprehensive and well-rounded education, our college has adopted a blended learning approach, incorporating both digital and analogue models.

1.1.2 Digital Model

Our digital model includes:

- 30% of notes projected on smart boards for interactive learning
- 30% of e-notes sent to students through our school website for easy access
- Online classes for flexible learning
- Online attendance system to notify parents of students' arrival and departure
- Computer-Based Testing (CBT) for objective exams
- Portal-generated report cards for efficient progress tracking

1.1.3 Analogue Model

Our analogue model includes:

- Notes copying with biro to develop handwriting skills
- Handwriting drills to improve penmanship

- Pen and paper essay examinations to assess critical thinking and writing skills

1.1.4 Enhancement

To further enrich our students' learning experience, we will be introducing:

- Short documentaries on important topics for each subject, accounting for an additional 10% of the overall notes
- Integrated computer curriculum comprising of:
- Application packages and graphics for JSS classes and web development for the SSS Classes.
- Integrated mathematics curriculum for all students

By combining these digital and analogue models, we aim to provide our students with a holistic education that prepares them for success in the 21st century.

1.2 Admission and Registration

The College is committed to a fair, transparent, and merit-based admission process. To ensure equal opportunities for all applicants, the following procedures are in place:

Admission Requirements:

- **Purchase of Registration Form:** Applicants are required to purchase a registration form, which can be obtained from the College's administrative office.
- **Entrance Examination:** Applicants must participate in a mandatory entrance examination, which assesses their academic abilities and preparedness for College-level studies.

- Continuous Improvement: The College is committed to continuous improvement, through regular review and assessment of policies, procedures, and practices.

1.3 Important Reminders:

1.3.1 School Dress Code Policy

Students are expected to adhere to the school dress code. Defaulters will be sent home, especially on Fridays.

1.3.2 Our Dress Code Requirements:

- Black covered shoes
- Black socks
- For girls, scarves that match their hijab color

1.3.3 Consequences of Non-Compliance:

- Improper dressing will attract penalties.
- Wrongly worn dresses will be seized and returned only at the end of the term.
- We expect all students to comply with the dress code policy to maintain a conducive and respectful learning environment.
- Punctuality is essential. The school gate will be closed by 8:00am. Late coming will not be tolerated.
- ICT gadgets are strictly prohibited in the college except on Thursdays
- Excessive makeup, jewelry, and henna are not allowed.

- End of second term examination comes up first week of third term so all students are expected at the college on the first day of resumption
- Parents who have paid for their ward's WAEC are reminded that payment for both second and third term tuition fees is still required and expected.
